Impact of leadership

Attainment:

- ✓ Due to the effectiveness of the PE coaching CPD over the last 3 years attainment at both ARE and ABOVE ARE has risen. Teaching is of a high quality and thus has resulted in a rise in the attainment across the whole of the school.

- ✓ The number of children attaining ABOVE ARE has risen in most year groups, demonstrating that children have been given additional opportunities to develop their skills further.

Planning, teaching & assessment:

- ✓ The quality of PE lessons have improved significantly and all staff are becoming more confident in their delivery of PE.
- ✓ As children are engaging more with their PE lessons and their skill level has risen. Children are now given further opportunity to share their skills with their peers both in school and after school.
- ✓ In addition to the curriculum PE, 78% of children accessed extra-curricular school clubs. This opportunity allowed them to try out and develop new skills in addition to the PE they receive within school.
- ✓ 41% of our less active children accessed extra-curricular activities.
- ✓ 38% of our Pupil Premium children accessed extra-curricular activities.
- ✓ 86% of our KS2 children had the opportunity to represent our Academy in an Inter-School competition.

Pupil Views

- ✓ 100% of pupils report that they enjoy PE lessons and feel more confident to apply their skills to other areas of the curriculum.
- ✓ All children report their love of practical lessons where they get the opportunity to share their own talent in and amongst their PE lessons

Future Plans to ensure continued development of **PE** within the curriculum: September 2020 – July 2021

- In the academic year of 2020-2021 the Academy will continue to embed the new scheme called Burn2Learn. This a scheme where our teachers enhance the activity levels of children into their everyday teaching within the classroom.
- Purchasing an online assessment tool called PE Passport which will allow teachers to effectively assess 'on the spot' as they teach.
- Ensuring a broader range of activities made available to our children to increase the fitness and well-being of every child. This will be achieved by enhancing our outdoor facilities within our school grounds.
