It is important that your grant is used effectively and based on school need. The <u>Education Inspection Framework</u> (Ofsted 2019 p64) makes clear there will be a focus on 'whether leaders and those responsible for governors all understand their respective roles and perform these in a way that enhances the effectiveness of the school'.

Under the <u>Quality of Education criteria</u> (p41) inspectors consider the extent to which schools can articulate their curriculum (INTENT), construct their curriculum (IMPLEMENTATION) and demonstrate the outcomes which result (IMPACT).

- The Primary PE and sport premium should not be used to fund capital spend projects; the school's budget should fund these.

This document will help you to review your provision and to report your spend. DfE encourages schools to use this template as an effective way of meeting the reporting requirements of the Primary PE and sport premium.

Key achievements to date until July 2021:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
 During lockdown the school continued to involve ALL children in Sports Day – those in school took part with teachers in bubbles and children at home took part in all planned activities in their garden, which parents photographed and video to upload on the Class Seesaw App. Children sent in their scores from home to add to their team colour total. ALL children in school took part in five Virtual Tournaments in the academic year 2020/21 competing with other schools in the Outwood Pyramid. Every child in school took part in the running challenge and raised money and awareness of the Diabetes Charity. We raised a total of £2800 for this charity. Year 6 were able to complete a Bikeability course in the Summer term. 	• For 2021/22 the main focus is to use the PE Sports Premium to upskill the teaching assistants who will teach one of the planned PE lessons. (baseline evidence – to date TAs have not received any PE CPD. Their only experience is to support the teacher in the delivery of a lesson).
