Academy Standards Committee: Helping to make Wrenthorpe Academy Even Better

Dear Parents & Carers,

Over the last few months, the Academy Standards Committee (parent, community and staff governors) have been working together to identify opportunity areas for school. We'd love you to take five minutes to read this letter and consider how you could get involved.

The idea behind the opportunity areas is to help us to achieve some longer term ambitions, alongside the work that is led day-to-day in school. For example, making sure that our curriculum is exciting, consistently well delivered and impactful; and children are supported with their personal development, behaviour and learning skills.

We are exploring the potential of four important areas:

- fundraising, business community and sponsorship
- volunteering
- outdoor learning environment and forest school
- · premises and indoor learning environment

There are connections across all of these areas and we can't do everything at once. We are hoping to start to make some changes in the spring and summer terms that will help to achieve even more great things in 2024/25 and beyond.

We're excited by what we can achieve together and to make sure that every part of school and our grounds, is oozing with learning potential to inspire curious minds, help build resilience, spread happiness, and grow independent learners. We want Wrenthorpe Academy pupils to feel valued and create and celebrate amazing learning memories together, both inside and outside of the classroom.

As you may be aware, school budgets are tight and being increasingly stretched. We are working hard to make every pound and penny count in the decisions we're taking. But unfortunately, it won't be enough on its own to achieve all that we know Wrenthorpe pupils deserve.

To help make sure that we can make the biggest difference possible, we will need input from pupils, parents/carers, staff and the wider school community through different forms:

- your ideas and feedback on what you most want to see and why
- time and effort (for example, to help with making days of action and events happen)
- donations (of money or resources)
- your own skills and know-how, or who-you-know (you may have business links or know of budding volunteers)
- and much more!



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We know things are difficult for many families too right now. If you feel you can support fundraising initiatives that's great, but it's not expected. There's so many different ways in which you and your children can get involved. This work is as much about building a fantastic school community as it is about trying to develop refreshed environments for learning in and having some 'wow' resources that children can feel excited about and proud of.

You'll have already heard about some of our early ideas for fundraising and relaunching the PFA. Thank you if you've already offered your support - it is much appreciated! We are currently a small group of parent volunteers plus staff, doing amazing things on top of their days spent teaching and leading.

The next area we're hoping to get off the ground for the spring, focuses on improving our outdoor learning environment. Please see the flyer attached for more details.

Sadly, over the last few years, due to the constraints of the pandemic; needs outgrowing budgets; and changes in staff who were our passion-leaders for the outdoors and growing/gardening, we've found it difficult to maintain all of this whilst doing our core job of keeping children safe and helping them to learn.

Why does this matter?

We know that all children benefit from learning actively and in different environments. We're big believers that being in nature is great for teamwork and early leadership skills, preparing children for sensible risk-taking, growing curiosity and confidence and for their physical health and mental wellbeing. For some children in particular, learning outdoors with the variety and sense of freedom this brings, is critical to their happiness and readiness to learn.

So, what's the plan?

Winter – we've already cleared overgrown areas and pruned shrubs.

February – gather volunteers, ideas and resources.

March – start the prep, dig the allotments over and enrich soil. Finalise planting calendar, curriculum links and rota of maintenance helpers.

April (DATE TBC) – day of action - sowing, planting and painting with help from parents & pupils

Summer – tending, picking, cooking, enjoying, and much more!

We'd love to repair what we can and fundraise to replace what we can't.
