

Big Ws

> A freestanding structure is a structure that stands on its own base without being attached to anything else.



Some materials are better than others when a creating free-standing structure because they are stronger and more rigid, e.g. card is stronger than paper.

Scoring material creates a crease so that if can be folded more easily and accurately.




