

Wet hands with water.




Rub hands palm to palm.

Rotational rubbing of left thumb clasped in right palm and vice versa.






Palm to palm with fingers



Class News Reception/Key Stage 1

Reception (Mrs Shute and Miss Brzostowska)

In Forest School, the children have continued to make their fairy houses and mud pies for the fairies. This outdoor experience is proving to be vital in developing creativity, communication and language and teamwork skills. In maths we have continued to explore the composition of the number 5 using our shake boxes. All children have challenged themselves throughout this week's provision areas and we are very proud!

1/2P (Miss Peden)

This week in 1/2P retold the story of The Very Last Castle in parts using our fantastic sentences. We have been practicing adding two-digit numbers together with physical resources. We have also enjoyed our One Life lessons this week where we discussed how to resolve conflict in our friendships.

3/4R
